



**SPORT PREMIUM STATEMENT – 2016/17**

The Sport Premium is an allocation of additional funding from the Department for Education, given to every school with primary age children to support the development of Physical Education, School Sport and Competition. This money is ring-fenced and is due to be provided for the next two academic years. The government continued the Sports Premium Funding allocating £450 million over the 3 academic years 2013- 14 2014-15 and 2015-16 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. Year 1 the school received an allocation of £9155, and a further allocation in Year 2 of £9200. Funding for the Year 3 academic year amounted to £9195, made up of an allocation of £5364 in November 2015 and £3831 in May 2016.

All schools are required to report on the amount of funding received and how this is being used, as well as the impact this is having on pupils.

There has been no confirmation from the government as yet as to how much allocation school will receive for 2016/17, although it is expected to be highly similar to funding for 2015/16. This funding will be used as follows:
