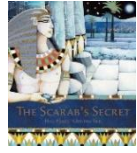


Walk Like An Egyptian

A narrative and description based on Scarab’s Secret.

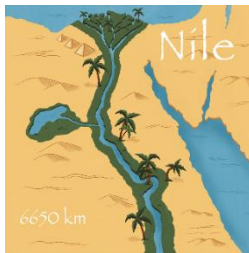
Instructions on how to mummify a Pharaoh.

Within Geography, key learning will be based on:

- Where is Egypt? What are the main geographical features of the country?
- Why was the Nile important to the Ancient Egyptians and is it still important today?



Within History, key learning will be:

- Who were the Ancient Egyptians?
- What was life like in Ancient Egypt?
- Were the kingdoms of Ancient Egypt built on slavery?
- Who was Tutankhamun and who discovered his tomb?
- Who were the Gods and what power did they have over the people?

Within **Maths** we will be following the programmes of study from the National Curriculum.

Opportunities for applying mathematical skills including reasoning will be given throughout the maths learning.



Our key learning in Science will be:



Light – recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect the eyes; recognise shadows are formed when the light is blocked and how/why the size of shadows change.

Animals. Including humans – nutrition, skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.



The **Art** focus will be creating Egyptian Tie Dye and exploring Egyptian collars.

Within **DT**, in cookery, Egyptian flatbread will be investigated, made and evaluated. There also will be a STEM unit using LEGO Spike Essential – Amazing Amusement Park.



Other curriculum areas:

RE: Christianity – What do Christians mean when they talk about the Kingdom of God? & Judaism – What symbols and stories help Jewish people remember their covenant with God?

RSHE: Changing me, Challenge yourself and online safety – What are the SMART rules?

PE: Athletics, Cricket, Tennis and Swimming (during Cophthorne Prep days)

Computing: Word, photo editing and online safety. Coding within the LEGO Spike Essential unit.

Music: Sharing musical experiences & Learning more about musical styles.

MFL: Continuing to develop our French speaking and listening skills using Rigolo.

This term, Year 3 will be experiencing Forest School, taking parts in a range of activities including wood craft, fire-making and den building, as well as learning to understand, appreciate and protect the forest environment. During two days at Cophthorne Prep, Year 3 will be experiencing golf, tennis, swimming and many other amazing activities.
