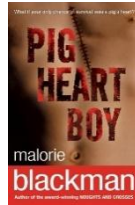

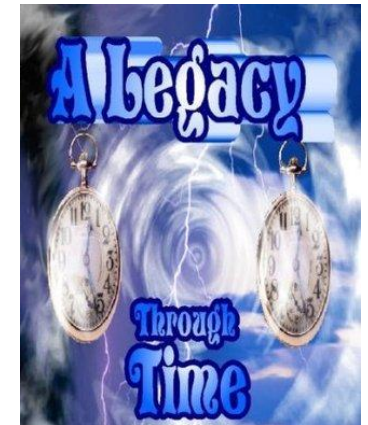
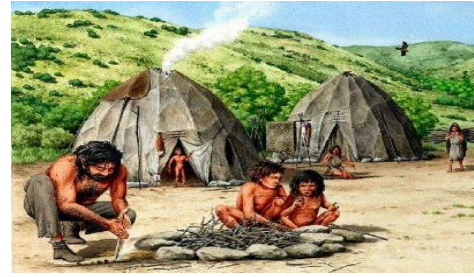
Year 6 Summer Term 2026

In Maths, we will be following the programmes of study from the National Curriculum.

Opportunities for applying mathematical skills including reasoning and arithmetic.



The writing opportunities this term will include:

Creating a balanced argument following on from a debate – should Cameron have the heart transplant?

Writing an adventure story based on journeying back through a period of history.



Within History, key learning will be:

Stone Age to Iron Age -

- Life in Stone Age times.
- Using historical evidence to gather information about the tools and buildings.
- How did life change from Stone Age to Iron Age?



Legacy through time –

- Tracking housing and shelter through time and consider how shelter will look in the future.

Within Science, key learning will be based on:

- Circulatory system.
- Recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way bodies function
- Describing the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.



Within Geography, key learning will be based on:

- What do coasts tell us about the environment?
- What is the human impact on our coastline?



The Art focus will be still life observational drawing, considering light and shade, symmetry and patterns. A photography unit will then be exploring patterns in nature, selecting one image to manipulate, present and evaluate.



The DT focus will be designing and creating Stone Age jewellery. Within food technology, Year 6 will be making celebration cupcakes



Other curriculum areas:

RE: Christianity – Should believing in the resurrection change how Christians view life and death? RE week will be learning about Humanism -Why do Humanists say happiness is the goal of life?

RSHE: Changing me, transition and Challenge yourself

PE: Athletics, Rounders, Tennis and Outdoor Adventurous Activities.

Computing: Excel spreadsheets and formulae and online safety – self-image and identity as well as health, wellbeing and lifestyle with technology.

MFL: Continuing to develop our French speaking and listening skills using Rigolo.

Music: Using chords and structures.

In addition, all Year 6 will be preparing for their end of year production, their leavers service with the Diocese and their own leavers service at Copthorne Junior School

They will also be visited by local magistrates to learn about our legal system.
